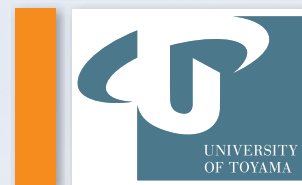

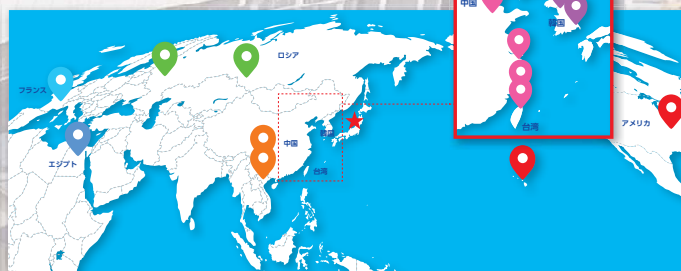
WHY THE UNIVERSITY OF TOYAMA ?

WHY THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES ?

The Faculty of Humanities consists of 9 unique programs of study with a total of 23 possible concentrations in various fields. Students can make use of a wide range of resources and opportunities for study, research, and personal growth. Many faculty members specialize in languages, cultures, and histories of East Asian countries, particularly those bordering the Sea of Japan. Courses specific to Japan include Japanese History, Literature, Linguistics & Philology, Thought & Ethics, Culture, Archeology, Language Education, and East Asia Regional Studies.

WHY THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF HUMANITIES ?

The Graduate School of Humanities offers a wide selection of courses where students can pursue their advanced studies. There are 15 advanced programs in all: Philosophy/Thought, History, Intercultural Studies, Psychology, Sociology and International Relations, Geography, Cultural Anthropology, Culture/Linguistics, and the Literature of countries such as Japan, China, Korea, England, the United States, Germany, France, and Russia.

After completing their master's degree in Toyama, some graduates teach Japanese outside of Japan.
